Thursday 1 September

From 13:00, room check-in at the Porter's Lodge, **Robinson College**, Grange Road, Cambridge **CB3 9AN**. Motorists may pre-book car parking permits (see over); unloading is permitted at College but car parking is 10-min walk away, or by shuttle bus. Registration for the Research Symposium and the Conference will be in the foyer from 13:00-14:00.

Coach leaves College at 14:00 for optional, pre-booked visit to **Chippenham Park gardens, CB7 5PT**. Motorists may meet the coach in car park at 14:45. Guided tour with **Twigs Way**, or self-tour. The restored 17-18C gardens, originally laid out in the Anglo-Dutch style with formal canals, were softened in the late 18C by William Emes and Samuel Lapidge who created an informal lake and gardens. In the late 20C Mrs Anne Crawley restored many of the features; her new plantings have matured into a superb addition to the historic landscape. At 16:30, coach returns to College, where delegates are free to explore Cambridge's varied dining opportunities (information available in the delegate pack).

Friday 2 September

Breakfast in the **Garden Restaurant** from 07:30-09:00 and browse the bookstalls, explore the college gardens, visit the Fitzwilliam Museum or other colleges. Delegates arriving Friday can register in the foyer, leaving luggage in a secure area, until room check-in (tba). A pre-booked finger buffet lunch will be available from 12:00 in the Garden Restaurant.

From 13:00-16:00 convene in the **Umney Theatre** for the **New Research Symposium**, followed by the first **annual general meeting** of The Gardens Trust. For those not attending the Symposium and AGM, a coach will depart from the front entrance of College at 14:00 for an optional, pre-booked, guided tour of **Cambridge University Botanic Garden, 1 Brookside, Cambridge CB2 1JE** (Brookside Gate). Coach will return to College in time for a guided tour of the gardens by **Guy Fuller**, leaving from the foyer at 17:00.

At 18:30, CGT President **Lord Fairhaven** will welcome delegates to the Conference at a buffet supper in the Garden Restaurant. Back in the Umney Theatre **David Brown**, CGT Chair, will then introduce **Steffie Shields'** talk on *Rivers real and illusory, Brown's handling of water in the landscape*.

Saturday 3 September

After breakfast, at 08:45, **Patrick Eyres** will speak to *The Politics and Patriotism of Capabilities: Lancelot Brown at Wimpole and elsewhere* in the Umney Theatre. Coaches then depart from College at 10:00 to visit **Fenstanton***, with an opportunity to view Brown's memorial in the **parish church**, and the **Manor House** that he owned and insured. At 11:45, coaches continue to **Wimpole Hall SG8 0BW**: do please bring your NT card if a member. After lunch, from the Stable Block entrance, **Philip Whaites** (Head Gardener), **Twigs Way**, **Steffie Shields** and **Alison Moller** will guide interpreted tours of Brown's landscape*. Coaches depart from the Stable Block at 16:30 to College and a further garden tour.

Steve Trudgill, Chair of Robinson's Gardens Committee, will open a **reception** preceding the **Conference Dinner**. After dinner **Twigs Way** will introduce **Tom Williamson** of UEA, and his talk on *The Capability Men: Lancelot Brown in context*.

Sunday 4 September

Following breakfast in the Garden Restaurant, please check out of rooms by 09:30; luggage may be left in the Porter's Lodge. Coaches depart from College at 09:30 to **Madingley Hall CB23 8AQ** where, after coffee, tours of the Brown gardens and park* will be guided by **Richard Gant** (Head Gardener) and CGT members. A **finger buffet** will be served in the Saloon before coaches depart at 13:30 to Queen's Road, for guided (or self-propelled) tours of **The Backs***. At 16:30, coaches will depart from Queen's Road to Robinson College to collect luggage, and continue to bus and train stations.
